The event will kick-off with a PSM Networking Social on Thursday evening from 5:30-7:30pm.The PSM workshop on Friday from 8:30-4:30 will consist of a series of panel discussions including:

- Preliminary results of the NPSMA Alumni Employment Survey
- Details on the pending NSF PSM solicitation
- PSM program peer review and feedback
- Modeling on program costs and expenses
- Best practices for PSM program branding

We will also have employer panelists speak about workforce development and engaging business clusters and biotech councils. PSM alumni and student panelists will share their employment and internship experiences.

## PSM well received at BIO International Convention in Atlanta

The Professional Science Master's degree was well represented last week at the BIO International Convention <u>www.bio.com</u>. BIO brought together 14,000 attendees and 1800 exhibitors from life sciences companies worldwide.

The PSM was featured in a breakout session which was attended by more than 60 industry and academic representatives. The panel was moderated by Joe Panetta, President of BIOCOM. Employer panelists included Diane Palumbo of Mannkind Corporation, NPSMA board member Don Peters of BD-Biosciences, and Scott Winston of Winston Biopharmaceutical Consulting. PSM program directors on the panel were Linda Strausbaugh from the University of Connecticut and Jung Choi from the Georgia Institute of Technology.

## NPSMA's two new major data projects: Alumni Employment; Roster of Employers

The NPSMA began conducting the first-ever **PSM Alumni Employment Survey** last week. The study asks graduates about their degree, their industry, and their employment status. This confidential questionnaire contains only twelve questions and takes each respondent no more than five minutes to complete.

The deadline to complete the survey is <u>June 10</u>. We plan to provide preliminary findings at our Quarterly Workshop in Nashville (see above).

The NPSMA is also creating a **Roster of Employers** (industry, government, nonprofit, academic) that partner with PSM degree programs. We are interested in identifying employers that serve on local advisory boards, host interns, oversee projects, provide infrastructure, and, most importantly, hire PSM graduates.

We are compiling this data to have better information when representing your programs with employers. For example:

- Which employers are on multiple local advisory boards?
- Which employers have hired PSM graduates from different PSM degree programs?
- Which government agencies recognize the benefits of the PSM degree?

We will use this information to encourage employers to get more involved in supporting the PSM movement nationally by:

- · Creating a ready pool of potential internship sites
- Posting job ads and becoming more involved in hiring PSM graduates
- Serving as consultants to developing PSM degree programs on an asneeded basis
